● Video Takedown (Strike or Removal 🏝)	Video was removed completely for violating YouTube's Community Guidelines.	Appeal if you're sure you did NOT violate the community guidelines or, re-upload an edited version.

Pro Tip: Three strikes in 90 days = Permanent channel deletion.

% Step 3: Fix & Appeal Violations

✓ If Age-Restricted:

- Blur or censor cannabis visuals (plants, products, consumption).
- Remove flagged words from the title, description, and tags.
- Request an appeal if you believe the restriction is unfair.

✓ If Demonetized:

- Check YouTube's monetization policy for advertiser-friendly content.
- Re-edit captions to remove flagged words.
- Submit for manual review after making changes.
- ✓ If Your Video Was Removed (Strike):
- Check YouTube's exact reason for removal.
- **2** Edit & re-upload a compliant version (if removal was justified).
- **3 Submit an appeal** if you believe it was an error.
- Pro Tip: Always rewatch your video before appealing to ensure compliance.
