

Premiere Pro Blurring Guide

This step-by-step guide shows you how to **blur or censor cannabis-related visuals** using **Adobe Premiere Pro** to keep your YouTube videos **compliant and monetized**.

Why Blurring Is Important

- ✓ YouTube AI scans videos for restricted visuals (cannabis products, consumption, branding).
- ✓ Unblurred visuals may trigger demonetization, age restriction, or removal.
- ✓ Proper blurring keeps your content safe while maintaining engagement.

How to Blur Objects in Premiere Pro

1 Apply the Gaussian Blur Effect

✓ Steps:

- 1 Import your video into **Premiere Pro** and drag it to the timeline.
- 2 Open the **Effects Panel** (Window → Effects).
- 3 Search for "**Gaussian Blur**" and drag it onto your video clip.
- 4 Open the **Effect Controls Panel** (Window → Effect Controls).
- 5 Adjust the **Blur Amount** until the object is properly obscured.

 **Pro Tip:** Set **Blurriness** to **30-50** for a natural blur effect.

2 Use Masking to Blur Specific Areas

✓ Steps:

- 1 In **Effect Controls**, under "Gaussian Blur," select "**Ellipse Mask**" or "**Rectangle Mask**."
- 2 Resize the mask to cover **the area you want blurred** (e.g., cannabis product, logo, or face).
- 3 Click "**Track Forward**" to follow the object as it moves.
- 4 Adjust feathering for a **smooth transition** between blurred and unblurred areas.

 **Pro Tip:** Increase feathering to **50+** for a softer blur.

3 Use Motion Tracking to Follow Moving Objects

✓ Steps:

- 1 Select the **mask** created in the Gaussian Blur effect.
- 2 Click "**Track Forward**" in the Effect Controls panel.
- 3 Premiere Pro will **automatically follow** the object and adjust the blur.
- 4 Manually refine the mask **frame by frame** if needed.

 **Pro Tip:** Use **keyframes** for more control over object movement.

How to Censor Words in Audio (Bleep Effect)

✓ Steps:

- 1 Open the **Audio Track Mixer** (Window → Audio Track Mixer).
- 2 Right-click your audio and select "**Edit in Adobe Audition**" (or use Premiere's built-in tools).
- 3 Search for "**Tone**" effect and drag it onto the timeline.
- 4 Adjust the **pitch and frequency** to create a bleep effect.
- 5 Export and replace the original audio in your Premiere project.

 **Pro Tip:** Use **silent gaps** instead of beeps for a smoother edit.
